## Covid-19 in Legae


As reports from the Covid-19 Presidential Task Force show, Covid-19 cases are on the rise. The school has also noticed an increase in cases during this term (Term 2).

## Information Communications Technology ICT in action under Covid-19 Protocols.



The ICT Cambridge curriculum exposes children to basic ICT skills divided into six modules. These are programming, Microsoft word, excel, internet searches, using e-mail and basic graphic designing.

There are three steps which comprise of the six modules mentioned above. The difference in the steps is that, they (the steps) become increasingly more advanced from step 1 (Initial Steps) through Step 2 (Next Steps) to step 3 (On Track).

It is the intention of the ICT department together with the Head of Academics (Deputy Headteacher) to have children write Step 1 at Std 5 and Step 2 at Std 6. This will allow Std 7's to focus on their final examination (Checkpoint)

Please note that the school can only offer Step 1 and Step 2.
