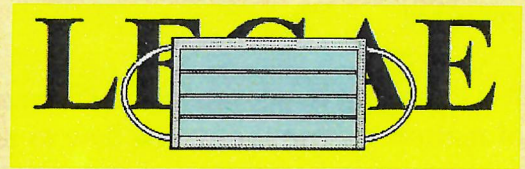
Security Concerns

Childhood Cancer Awareness-September 2022

Legae English Medium School focused on raising awareness on Childhood Cancer on Friday, 23 September 2022. Our Standard 4 Red class presented a dance to encourage, not only those who suffer from cancer, but also their families who go through this challenging time with these “warriors”. The message that was sent was to remind these children that they are braver than they realize and stronger than what they think they are.

Leukemia, which is cancer in the bone marrow or blood, are the most common childhood cancer. Studies have shown that children who are affected by this type of cancer are normally between 1 and 14 years old.

It is important to educate our children on these types of matters so that they know how to encourage and support someone who is experiencing this challenge.

Considerations for vaccinating adolescents and children

COVID-19 vaccines with WHO EUL that have undergone clinical trials in children and adolescent are safe and effective in preventing disease in children and adolescents.

The Regional DHMT vaccinated approximately 200 children aged from 5 years to 11 years. This was done with the consent from parents and the support of the school internal support group (SHE Officers). Parents are expected to report any negative side effects of the Covid-19 vaccine to the nearest health facility.

Though some of the school population is vaccinated, the school will continue to enforce and adhere to the Covid-19 protocols to ensure that our students learn in a safe and conducive environment. Parents are encouraged to have their children vaccinated.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE

The International Day of Peace was observed on 16 September 2022 at the United Nations headquarters. The program begun with the traditional Peace Bell Ceremony in the Peace Garden. The Peace Bell was donated by the United Nations Association of Japan in 1954. It has become a tradition to ring the bell twice a year: on the first day of spring, at the Vernal Equinox, and on 21 September to celebrate the International Day for Peace.

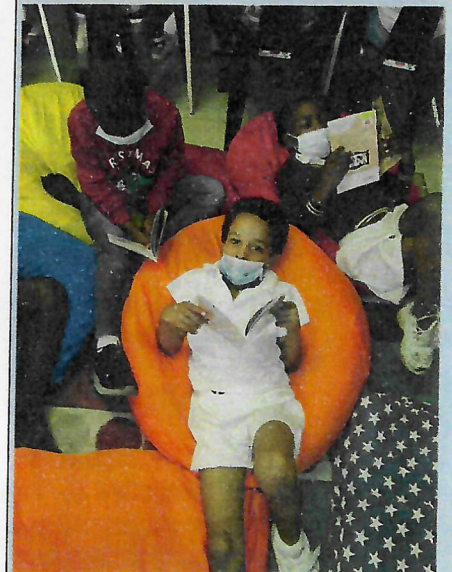

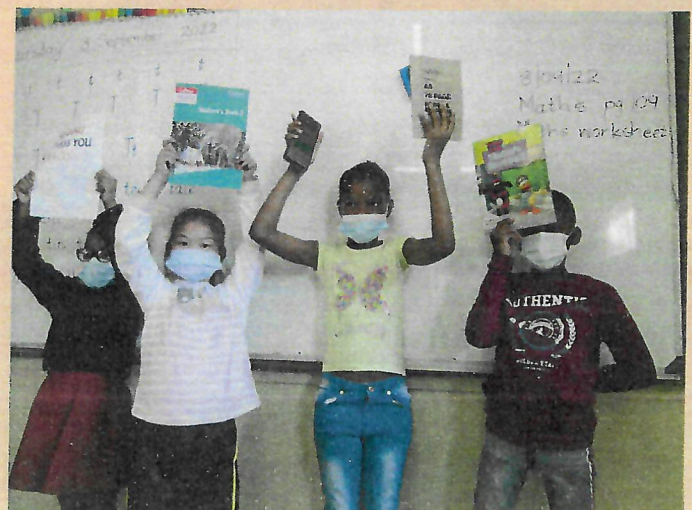


International Literacy Day 2022 Activities for Students
